

Salty Sharks



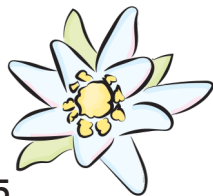
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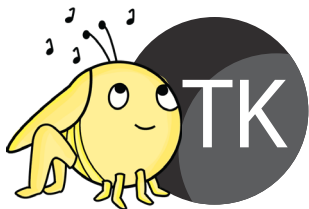
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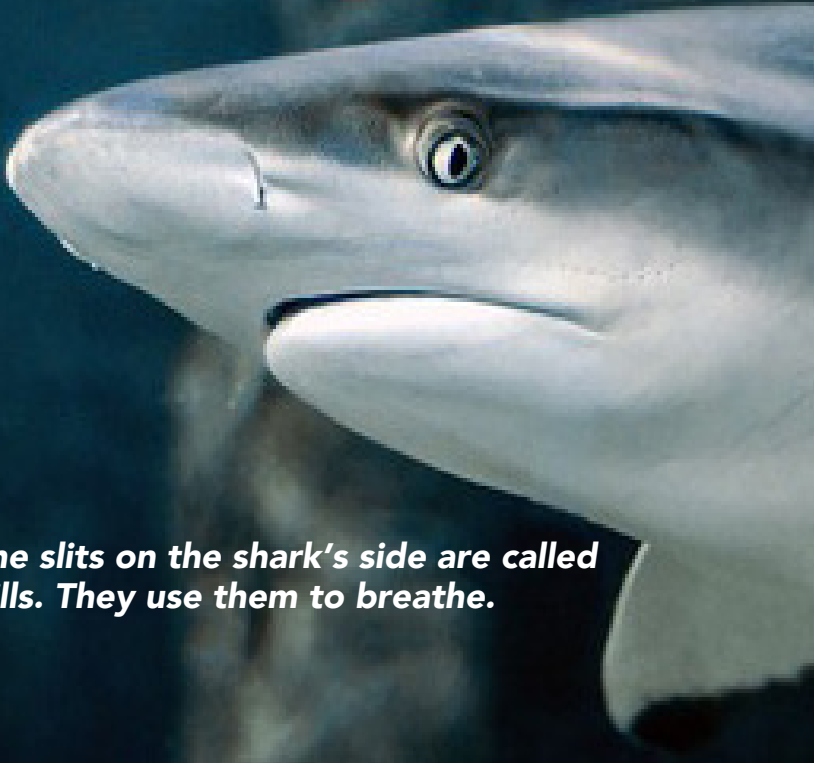
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Sharks are fish that live in the ocean.

before dinosaurs.

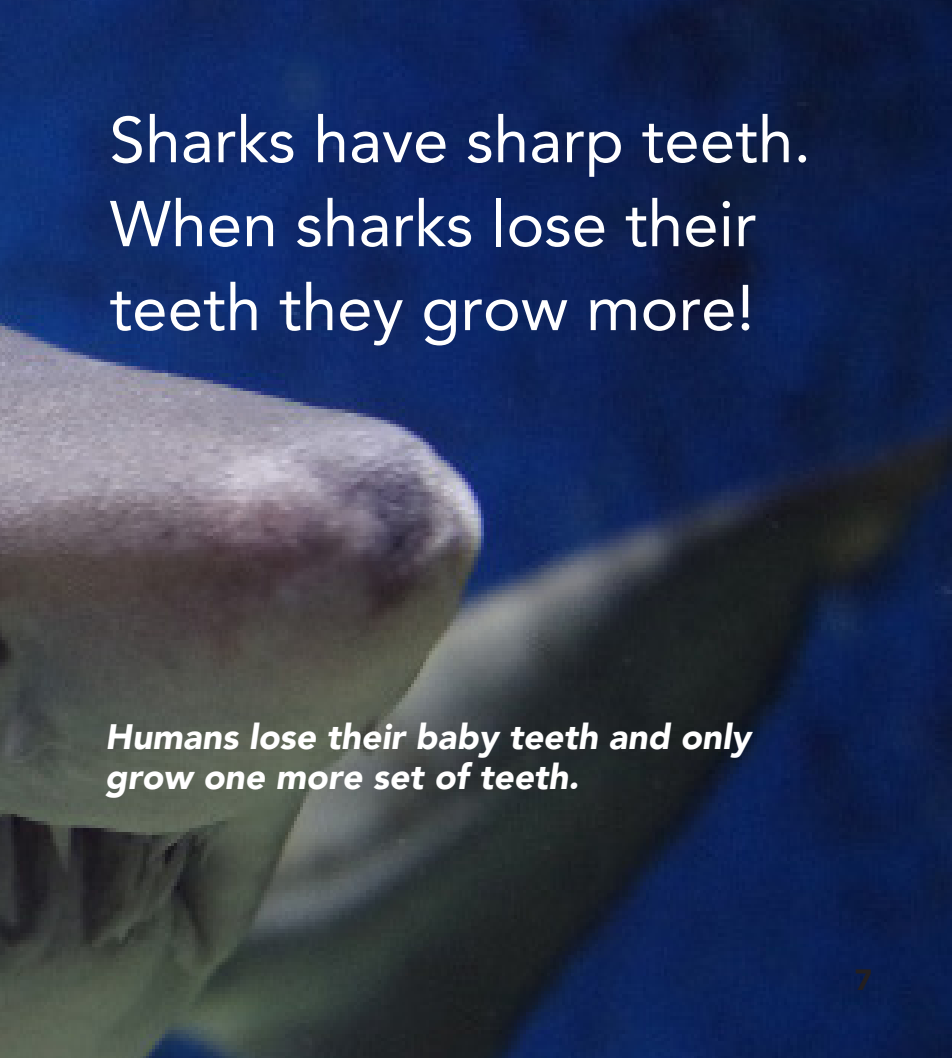
Sharks can be as small as

carnivores.



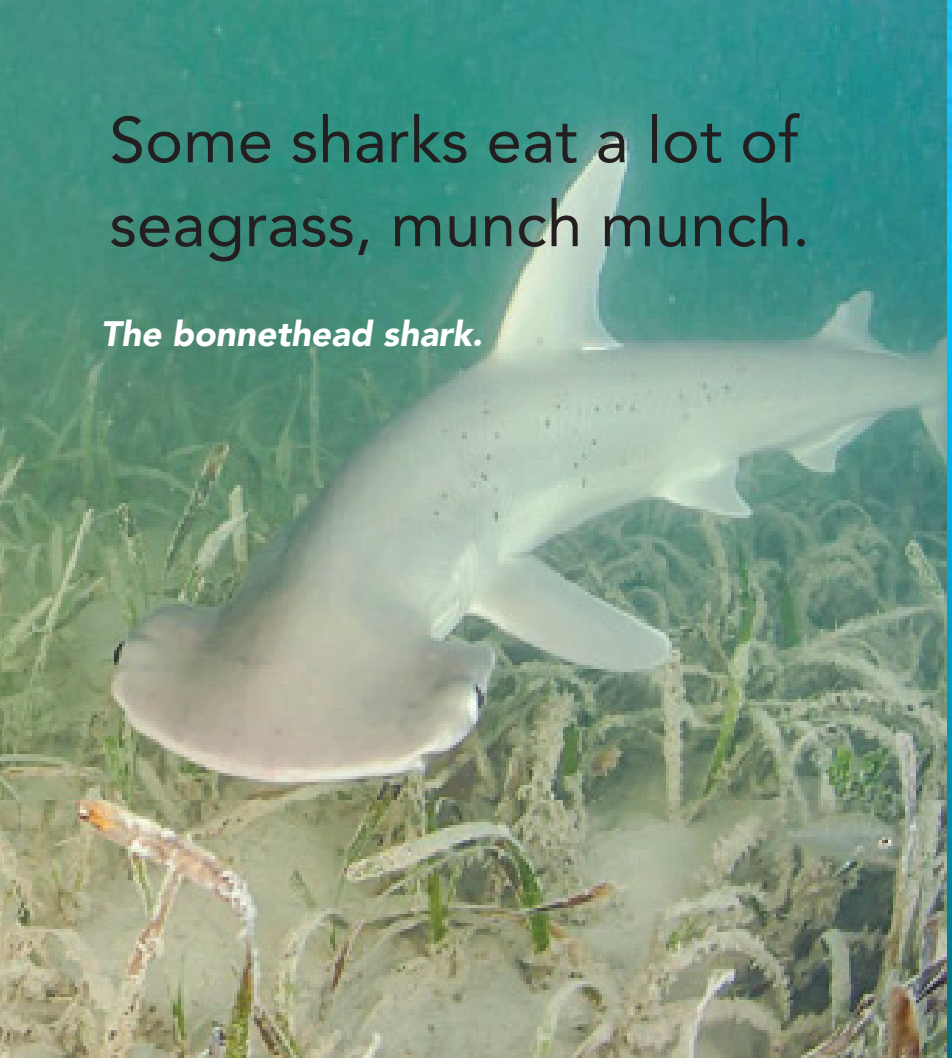
The great white shark is carnivorous.

our nose and ears.

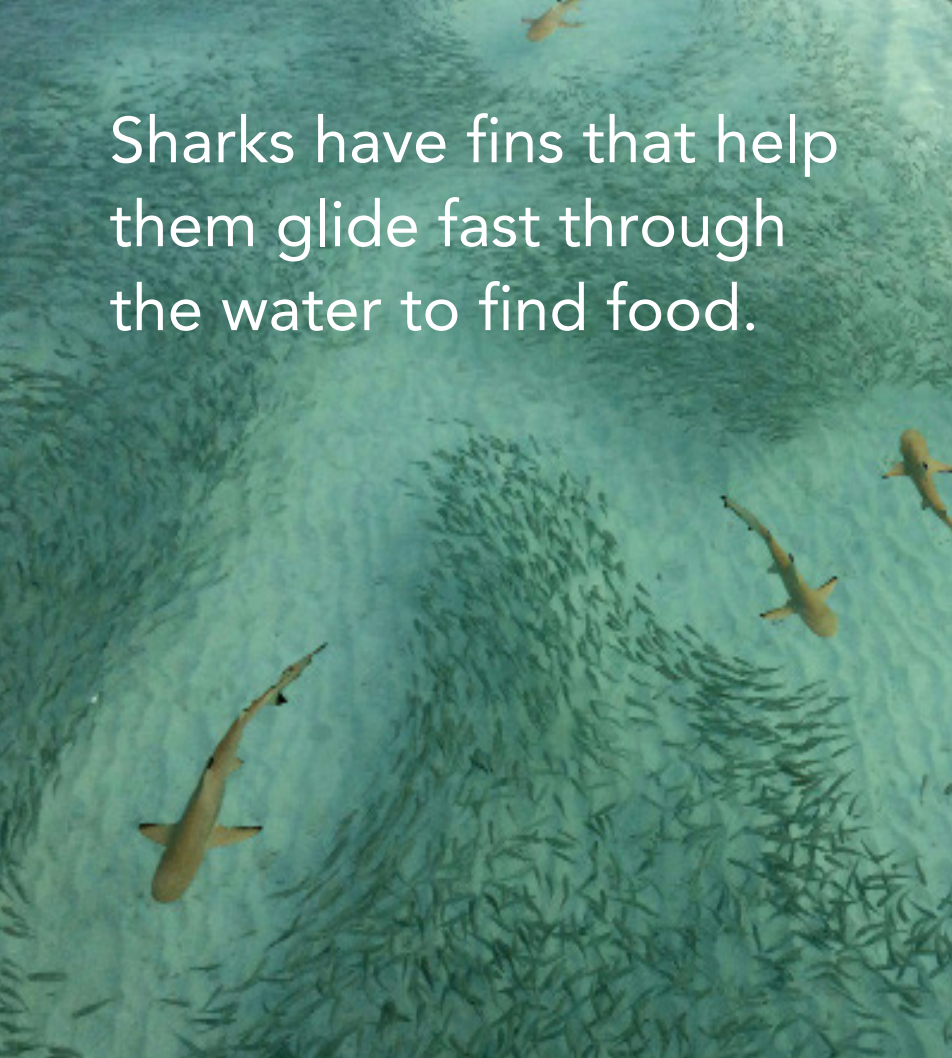


Sharks have a liver that

different ways!

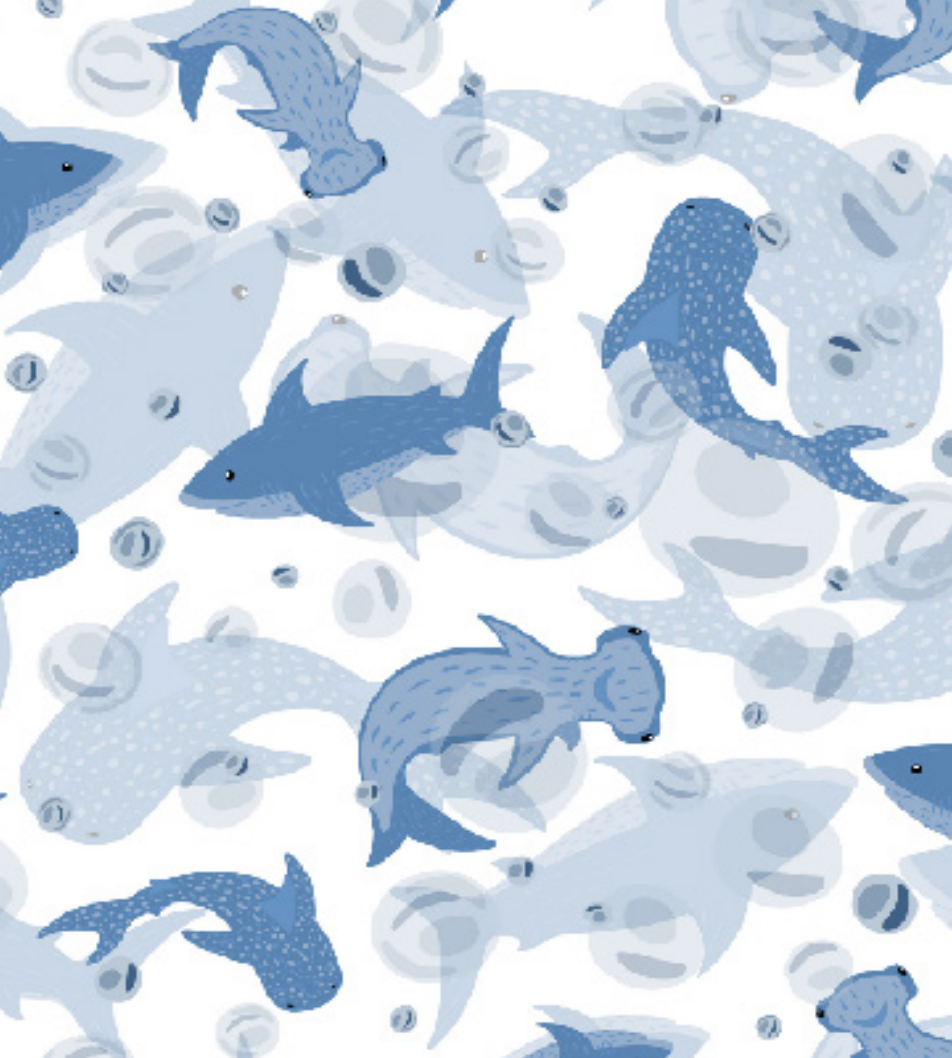


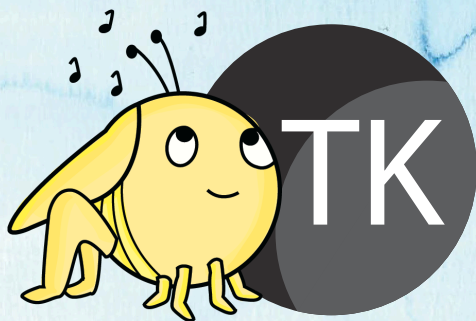
Some sharks give birth to live babies, others hatch eggs inside of their bellies and some lay eggs.





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
