




## Soupy The Super Seed




Once upon a time there was a seed named Soupy. Soupy was just a plain pinto bean.




Soupy didn't want to be a plain pinto bean. Soupy wanted to be a super seed!

Soupy learned how to hitch a ride on animals.




Soupy learned how to fly through the air.

Now Soupy wasn't just an ordinary pinto bean. He had super powers to help him travel just about anywhere!




Soupy was really super. Now Super Seed would dedicate the rest of his life to going on adventures!
