



A lynx is a wild cat. A lynx is a danger to a baby deer.




"Dappy, you must stay still to hide from danger," said mother deer.




Dappy did not stay still. Dappy liked to dance.

Wait, that is not a lynx. It was Brother! Dappy was so glad.




"You did it, Dappy! You hid from danger!" said Mom. Mom was happy.




Dappy can still dance, but when danger is near she knows what to do!
