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

A Spiffy le gustaba escuchar música nueva. Cantó junto con el banjo.




Spiffy liked to hear new music. He sang along with the banjo.

'Boom-ba-boom," Spiffy cantó mientras sus amigos bailaban.




'Boom-ba-boom," Spiffy sang as his friends danced.

Entonces Spiffy vio a la abuela con su flauta. La flauta hizo una dulce canción.




Then spiffy saw Granny with her flute. The flute made a sweet song.
